












LCDR Eapen





If You Build It...They Will Come

- September 2020 Original LDP UPIC Concept
- May 2021 Final LDP UPIC Project Presentation
- June 2021 5 non-SAME National attendees for the initial United Engineering Foundation (UEF) grant proposal meeting
- October 2021 10 for the first meeting after UEF grant and was awarded and SAME Foundation supplemented
- **December 2022** 16 at the time of the final UEF report

We Must Go to Them funded initiative

- Funds supported existing STEM outreach to AI/AN communities on the local level through four SAME Posts' STEM Committees to increase awareness and build partnerships that will enhance stewardship across tribal lands.
 - Panama City, Florida
 - Albuquerque, New Mexico
 - Anchorage, Alaska
 - Tulsa, Oklahoma

Florida Governor's Council on Indian Affairs Summer Camp

- Already an established program
- 50 high school youth, Tallahassee, FL
- Traditional cooking, solar cars, catapults, construction
- Provided funding for supplies, backpacks, lodging
- Provided Post volunteers during the event
- Not the Post's first time supporting this organization





















Southwest Region – Albuquerque Post, NM

The Albuquerque Post provided support to three organizations

- Santa Ana Pueblo Youth Hands-on Hydrology Outreach (SAYH20) STEM kits related to hydropower, alternative & renewable energy, environmental science, fluid dynamics, and more.
- Santa Ana Pueblo 21st Environmental & Health Fair Hands-on geological exhibits and giveaways for all ages to increase environmental awareness.
- American Indian Services Pre-Freshman Engineering Program (AIS) PREP) - Robotics kits, 3D printer and filament, & Chromebooks.
- New Mexico Mathematics, Engineering, and Science Achievement (NM) MESA) STEM Ag Career Fair Day – Provided transportation & housing costs for 115 students and chaperones from native communities all over NM with financial & transportation limitations to attend the career fair in person.
