### Presenter's Bio



Mr. Sullens has 7 years of experience in the investigation, design and construction of heating, ventilating and air conditioning (HVAC) systems. He has designed a wide variety of HVAC systems for various facilities but his specialty is related to the Geothermal Heat Pump (GHP) field. Specifically, he has experience and knowledge of executing building energy simulations and Geothermal Heat Pump Ground Loop Heat Exchanger (GHX) computer modeling for the purposes of sizing geothermal well fields by utilizing a wide variety

of software and analysis programs.

He also is an expert in performing all field work and in-office data analysis associated with In-Situ Thermal Conductivity Testing (TCT) and Analysis for GHP systems with Borehole/GHX systems. He has field experience within industrial and commercial facilities includes airflow, pressurization, temperature and relative humidity analysis, which are used for submitting recommendations to clients to solve a variety of HVAC problems.

Much of this experience has been in the design of HVAC systems for colleges/ universities, U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) and industrial/institutional facilities. As both a geothermal heat pump engineer during the HVAC design phase and commissioning assistant at the end of many Geo project's, Stephen is typically involved in a project from beginning to end.

**Preview of February 2015 SAME Presentation entitled "Geothermal Heat Pumps: USTES Project Update".** This presentation will be given by Stephen Sullens of Andrews, Hammock & Powell, Inc.

Underground Thermal Energy Storage (UTES) is the concept of storing excess heat in the ground in the summer, to then be extracted in the winter. Renewable energy sources such as solar thermal produce most of their heat when it is not required and hence, it is wasted. For this reason, it is becoming increasingly common to use integrated seasonal heat storage to improve the total system efficiency.

Our presentation will give an overview of the fundamentals of UTES systems and then go into more detail about two Georgia-specific UTES systems, one at the Marine Corps Logistics Base (MCLB) and one at Ft. Benning. The one in MCLB is a bore hole thermal energy storage (BTES) system and the one in Ft. Benning is an aquifer thermal energy storage (ATES) system.

### Troop 220 Update for 2015

Boy Scout Troop 220 completed another spectacular year of scouting in 2014, marking the 57th year of operation for the unit (established on Base in 1956). In October the Scouts manned an information booth at the Base's Fall Bash event and in November the Troop assisted Outdoor Recreation with their Base Camp – Overnight Camping Event, by providing camp cooking demonstrations and teaching map and compass skills.
