Preview of July 2016 SAME Presentation. This presentation will be given by Mr. Bob Staib of HQ AFRC.

Headquarters Air Force Reserve Command, located at Robins Air Force Base, GA, ensures its three numbered air forces, one space wing, 33 flying wings, 12 flying groups and other subordinate units are prepared to accomplish their total force missions. The command supervises the unit-training program, provides logistics support and ensures combat readiness.

Mr. Bob Staib, the Deputy Command Civil Engineer, will be giving the annual overview of Air Force Reserve Command Installation Programs, which will include facilities, energy, environmental, and contracting projects.

Mr. Robert J. Staib is the Chief, Civil Engineer Division and the Deputy Command Civil Engineer at HQ AFRC. He oversees installation assets at nine primary and 57 tenant locations comprising a \$6.7 billion plant replacement value and is responsible for the execution of \$1.41B MILCON and \$1.57B Facilities Sustainment, Restoration, and Modernization programs. He leads a staff of 62 military and civilian professionals meeting the engineering needs of command's

3 numbered air forces, 35 wings, 10 independent groups and various mission support units.
