Preview of May 2013 SAME Presentation, entitled “Pavement Preservation Technology: Case Studies”. This presentation will be given by Mr. Adam Bruner of PMS Construction.

Pavement Preservation Technology

In times of funding constraints and getting the best value for the dollars spent in construction, technologies are available to protect and repair asphalt by sealing and restoring the asphalt flexibility and slow the asphalt aging. Four case studies are presented that demonstrate the benefits of the use of one of these technologies, as well as how this can be applied to the military installation (airfields, parking areas, roads, etc). Benefits that are demonstrated include:



- ◆ **Resulting money savings** – Paverx eliminates the need to apply the traditional sealcoating and restriping every 1 – 3 years
- ◆ **Prevents fuel damage** – As a penetrating sealer, Paverx application keeps leaking fuel from breaking down the maltenes component in asphalt
- ◆ **Meets highway and aviation requirements** - ASTM specification meets requirements of highway and road departments and FAA EB44 and FAA Draft P-629
- ◆ **Keeps “curb appeal” longer** - Application seals and protects the asphalt while restoring asphalt flexibility and halts asphalt aging and stops surface cracking by softening the hard binder
- ◆ **Key component of Asphalt Preventative Maintenance Programs-** By rejuvenating and sealing the asphalt from environmental factors that cause deterioration, the life span of the asphalt is extended

The conclusion of the case studies compares the technology to the traditional sealcoating and how the pavement preservation technology can outperform and outlast the traditional method.
